






Participants profiles – Exchanges with South Med countries






2015-2018 Call results overview

22 structural projects (15,5 %) mainly in Maghreb Countries


80 National projects

52 projects coordinated by a South Med university (37 %) mainly in Middle East countries




CBHE projects on Curriculum Development 2015-2018








